

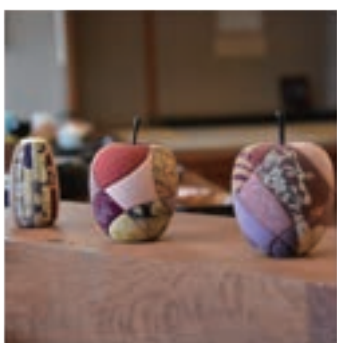

**D Mt. Hitsurugi (Mt. Hitsurugi campsite)**  
Highest peak of Kikugawa City (Altitude 282m)  
There also has a campsite with bungalows, camping grounds, and shower rooms.  
Need reservation at least 7 days in advance.

**E Tannoike Park**  
Suspension bridge over the valley, pavilion, and wood decks are maintained, and the area becomes the viewing spot with full of cherry blossoms in spring. Kikugawa Mayor's Cup Tannoike RC Yacht Competition and Japanese National Championships are held



**F Kikugawa Athletic Park**  
There are many facilities such as the baseball field, lawn ground as the multipurpose open space, castle hill, lawn game field, dogs field, and mini cross country course.



**G Sionomichi Park**  
There is a hill inspired by the Alps which has the walking paths, streams, and ponds with the images of the "Shionomichi (Salt Road)". Many kinds of municipal trees are planted along the walking path, and there is the monument of the black obsidian as the proof of the "Shionomichi" exchanges.



**H Kikugawa Park**  
Every April, a special festival is held during the Shinsa (newly-picked tea) season. From late March to early April, about 200 Somei-Yoshino cherry trees are lit up to enjoy seeing cherry blossoms at night.



**I Wada Park**  
There are picnic fields, multipurpose open spaces, and tennis courts in this park. The community swimming pool also opens during the summer season.



**J Hasuike Park**  
This park has the accommodation facility "Kogikuso" owned by Kikugawa City and Shishigahana Fort Ruins, where you can spend your relaxing time. This park is also a great viewing place of cherry blossoms in spring, where many children have fun cheerully.

**K Kuroda Family Local Governor's Residence**  
Nationally Important Cultural Property  
It's gate, main house, rice granary, Higashikura, and trench are designated as the Nationally Important Cultural Properties.  
The "Plum Festival" is held in the beginning of February through the beginning of March every year at the plum garden which opens publicly in this period.

**L Kikugawa City Museum of Kuroda Family Local Governor's Historic House**  
Museum built in the site.

**M Yokoji Castle Ruins**  
Nationally Designated Historical Landmark  
The largest and oldest mountain castle ruins in this prefecture. About 500 cherry trees are in bloom and the cherry festival is held at this place in spring.

**N Shishigahana fort ruins**  
Fort ruins built by Tokugawa Ieyasu in June, 1580 for the purpose of attacking Takatenjo Castle.

**O Daitouryu Shrine**  
Well known by the largest bronze Torii in the Enshu District. It's one of the Kikugawa City Cultural Properties.

**P Jodo Shusho Fureizan Osho kyoin**  
There are properties of Shoro-do, Aizenmyo-o-do, Mizukojizo-bodaijo, together with Mizukojizo Stone Buddha and Nombe Jizo, both are donated by China. The vermilion gate, Sanmon, is designated as the Nationally Important Cultural Property.

Imagawa Ujichika built the Shokeiji Temple, origin of this temple, near Shiokaizaka in 1517 for the purpose of mourning his late father, Yoshitada.

**R Red Brick Warehouse**  
1425, Horinouchi, Kikugawa City  
This historical building was built in the end of Meiji period which tells the history of Kikugawa City's tea industry. It was the first property in Kikugawa City which was registered as the National Cultural Property.

**S Rice Field art Kikugawa**  
Kikugawa City Shimouchida Inaribe District  
Rice Field Art Kikugawa Large rice field art by planting ancient rice of various colors. There are events of rice planting in May, the "Great Viewing Party" in July, and the "Harvest Festival (with rice reaping)" in September.



**T Sengamati Rice Terrace**  
Kikugawa Uekurazawa  
Sengamachi Rice Terrace  
There is the terraced rice field called "Sengamachi". The event of the Rice Terrace Art with more than 1,300 candles and 60 torches on the trail of rice field is held to produce a wonderful scene at night in March.
